She is the author of *Space Travelers and the Genesis of the Human Form*, and *Phenomenal World*, both published by The Book Tree ([www.thebooktree.com](http://www.thebooktree.com)). She is the editor of the 1996 book *Paranoid Women Collect Their Thoughts* and the Chief Resident of the Paranoid Women Institute. She has a degree in Anthropology and is the founder of the website, *BIPED: Beings for Intelligent Purpose in Evolutionary Design*, the Website of Darwinian Dissent ([www.biped.info](http://www.biped.info)).

She is also the co-editor of *The Conspiracy Reader* and *The New Conspiracy Reader* (Kensington Press), which has been translated to Japanese and Romanian. She has been published in several compilations including *Wake Up Down There*, *The Universal Seduction*, and the French Fortean journal, *La Gazette Forteenne*.
